JACK SHEEHAN AWARD SUBMISSIONS CRITERIA

During an architecture career spanning more than 40 years, Jack Sheehan was instrumental in shaping the cityscape of the Northern Nevada urban area as well as providing design services and expertise to rural Nevada. His designs and professionalism have served the standard of what is good and pure about architecture. His passion to enrich the built and natural environment continues to inspire us.

In recognition of his contributions to the design, the profession and the communities he served, Jack received the AIA Nevada Silver Medal Award, the most revered award one can receive in the state.

The AIA Northern Nevada chapter honors Jack's memory by creating an award category to recognize design efforts that inspire, shape and influence the character of our community.

ELIGIBILITY

Nominations shall come from AIA Northern Nevada members (one nomination per member).

The nomination may be for an individual, project or firm (choose one) that has enriched the built and natural environments and positively impacted the architecture of Northern Nevada and the Eastern Sierra.

There are no time specific limitations, although, this is not intended for contemporary work or designers who are eligible to submit to the design awards program.

CATEGORIES (CHOOSE ONE CATEGORY)

INDIVIDUAL – An outstanding individual distinguished for creating, or being supportive of exceptional quality in architectural design and the built environment in Northern Nevada.

PROJECT – Project must be built in the Northern Nevada/ Eastern Sierra region defined as Lake Tahoe- Truckee area, south to Tonopah, east and north to the Nevada state border.

FIRM – Principal(s) must be (or must have been) AIA Northern Nevada members.

WINNERS

Winners will be determined from member nominations with ratification by an architect selection committee from the Board of Directors. This may include a vote by the membership of the top three. No member of the selection committee may be associated with the individual, project or firm being considered.

Winner's projects within a 100-mile radius of Reno will be featured with photography in RENO Magazine May/June 2007 issue and for web site use. RENO Magazine will absorb all expense of any additional photography necessary for publication after review of submittal binder.

Winners outside of the 100-mile radius must submit professional photography of the project at the winner's expense. Photography must include at least two photos for the category of Individual or Firm and five photos for the category of Project, 4" x 6" size at a minimum of 300 DPI showcasing the individual or firm or projects top features.
