It was symbolically underground as the network's clandestine activities were secret and illegal so they had to remain "underground" to help fugitive slaves stay out of sight. The term "railroad" was used because the railroad was an emerging system of transportation and its supporters used railroad code to communicate in secret language.

Born a slave, Harriet Tubman was determined not to remain one. She escaped from her owners in Maryland on the Underground Railroad in 1849 and then fearlessly returned thirteen times to help guide family members and others to freedom as the most famous conductor of the Underground Railroad. As she proudly claimed, she "never lost a passenger."
